Samford University is a leading nationally ranked Christian university. Founded in 1841, Samford is the 87th-oldest institution of higher learning in the United States. Located in the Birmingham, Alabama suburb of Homewood, the university's campus covers approximately 247 acres and is renowned for its beauty and Georgian-Colonial style architecture. The university currently enrolls 6,101 students from 45 states, Puerto Rico and 16 countries. Samford is regularly recognized as one of the best Christian universities in the United States, receiving high marks for academic quality and value.

Samford offers undergraduate programs grounded in the liberal arts and a distinct blend of graduate and professional schools through 10 academic schools: arts, arts and sciences, business, divinity, education, health professions, law, nursing, pharmacy, and public health. The university has one of three accredited law schools and one ofw only two accredited pharmacy schools in Alabama. The university is classified by the Carnegie Commission on Higher Education as a doctoral/professional institution and the student-to-faculty ratio is 14:1.

Samford's mission to nurture student development intellectually, ethically and spiritually is fostered through an array of opportunities, including 170 student organizations, global engagement in more than 19 different countries and dozens of courses that incorporate community service. Additionally, undergraduate students complete Samford's core curriculum, providing a well-rounded foundation in the liberal arts. The result is a highly-tailored educational experience that results in 97% of undergraduate alumni employed or in further study within six months of graduation.

Samford launched its next comprehensive strategic plan in December 2022. The plan, "Fidelitas: Faith and Future," is aligned along eight themes: academic distinction, student engagement, employee elevation, faith formation, community celebration, athletic success, financial stewardship and global influence.

Based on the university's strategic plan, Fidelitas, the first phase of the campus master plan, Samford Horizons: A Blueprint for Tomorrow, was approved by Samford's board of trustees in December 2023. The plan addresses infrastructure needs for the entire campus, increases energy efficiency, practices campus-wide conservation, and refreshes and renews every facility—all steps in the process of creating a sustainable future for generations of Samford students. The Campus Recreation, Wellness and Athletics Complex opened in September 2024, followed by four residential halls coming on line in the Fall of 2025.

Samford maintains a strong endowment with investments totaling \$453.6 million (June 2024), which helps support scholarships, study abroad opportunities, general operations and other programs. In addition to the main campus in Homewood, the university owns a house in Marion, Alabama, used for cultural study and service, and the Daniel House, a study center located in the heart of London, England, near Kensington Park.

Samford has 57,633 alumni living in all 50 states and 58 foreign countries. The university's alumni have included more than 60 members of the U.S. Congress, eight state governors, two U.S. Supreme Court justices, one U.S. Secretary of State, four Rhodes Scholars, multiple Emmy and Grammy award-winning artists, two national championship football coaches, and recipients of the Pulitzer and Nobel Peace prizes.

The university fields 17 intercollegiate sports—eight men's and nine women's that participate at the NCAA Division I level. The Samford Bulldogs have won 80 conference championships since joining the Southern Conference in 2008. Samford's athletic teams were ranked with the second-highest score in the nation by the NCAA, earning a 98% Graduation Success Rate (GSR) among all Division I universities nationwide. Mission

The mission of Beeson Divinity School is to prepare God-called persons to serve as ministers in the church of Jesus Christ. We accomplish this by providing face-to-face, classical graduate theological education, worshiping the triune God and encouraging the practices of Christian spirituality in covenanted community.

Distinctions

- More than 15 Protestant denominations are represented among the faculty, staff and students.
- Divinity faculty believe theological education happens best face to face, and the student body is kept small (under 200 students) by design. The faculty-to-student ratio is 1:7. Every student takes part in a weekly faculty-led mentor group. Students, faculty and staff worship together every Tuesday and then share a common meal.
- The Global Center allows divinity students to participate in global Christianity by sending equipped students into every part of the world and by hosting speakers from around the world. Every MDiv student is required to participate in a cross-cultural ministry experience.
- 100% of full-time master's degree students receive scholarship assistance.
- The divinity school hosts four annual lectures: Biblical Studies Lectures, William E. Conger Lectures on Biblical Preaching, the Reformation Heritage Lectures and the Reformation Anglicanism Lecture, in addition to an annual preaching conference.
- Numerous divinity school faculty members published books recently, including Alexander Kirk (Agur's Wisdom and the Coherence of Proverbs 30), Robert Smith Jr. (ESV Audio Bible), Chip Hardy (Going Deeper with Biblical Hebrew; The State of Old Testament Studies), Douglas Webster (More than a Sermon: The Purpose and Practice of Christian Preaching), Osvaldo Padilla (The New Testament in Color: A Multiethnic Bible Commentary).
- The divinity school offers three certificates to those MDiv students who complete the requirements: Anglican studies, missions and Wesleyan studies.

- The divinity school's Andrew Gerow Hodges Chapel was consecrated as a hallowed place
 of worship in 1995 and is dedicated to the glory of the living Triune God for the service
 of His church and the furtherance of His kingdom. This chapel is spoken of as "A Sermon
 in Stone" for its Gospel witness through sacred art and architecture to the Samford
 community, the greater Birmingham community and the far-reaching places of the world.
- The Institute of Anglican Studies at Beeson Divinity School builds the Anglican Communion by helping educate students and the public in the riches of the Anglican tradition.
- The Robert Smith Jr. Preaching Institute at Beeson Divinity School exists to serve and strengthen the whole person in relation to God, the church, other preachers and the world for faithful proclamation of God's Word. It seeks to do this by increasing knowledge and understanding as a preacher, deepening formation as a Christian and preacher, and strengthening competence and skill in the practice of preaching. The Lilly Endowment Inc. awarded Samford a \$1.2 million grant for The Spirit and Power Preaching Project, which is coordinated by the Robert Smith Jr. Preaching Institute. The project offers opportunities for both divinity students and undergraduate students to improve their preaching, as well as offering opportunities to sharpen those who are already preaching.
- The Thriving Pastors Initiative at Beeson Divinity School aims to help pastors thrive in congregational leadership by improving the quality of relationships pastors have with one another. It is funded by a \$1 million grant from the Lilly Endowment Inc.
- Beeson's Lay Academy of Theology provides continuing education for ministers and laity taught by Beeson faculty.
- The Center for Women in Ministry at Beeson exists to encourage and equip women called to Christian ministry and to serve as a resource for the church of Jesus Christ for the edification of the church and for the thriving of women in ministry.
